

2017 PSAT

What is the PSAT?

The PSAT is a two hour and fifty-five minute practice college entrance exam that includes Critical Reading, Math and Writing. The purpose of the PSAT is to predict success and provide practice in taking college entrance exams. The PSAT measures your ability to reason using facts that are part of your general knowledge or facts that are included in your test booklet.

Who should take the PSAT?

All sophomores are eligible to take the exam at NO cost. The PSAT is strongly recommended for students who have a 2.5 GPA or higher and are currently in Geometry or above in math and are planning to go directly to a four year University upon graduation.

Test Date: Wednesday, October 11th (during School 7:40 am- 11:45 am)

Location: Oregon City High School

Transportation: Buses will run at normal times for students taking the test.
Return buses will run after test is over and lunch is served.

Cost: Free for 10th Grade Students
