A Letter to Prospective Contestants:

Dear Senior at OCHS,

Thank you for your interest in our 5th annual Oregon City High School Survivor Week. Should you be selected, you will embark on one of the most difficult, yet rewarding journeys of your life.

The game play is as follows: 12+ players split between two or more "tribes" and they are locked inside Oregon City High School and forced to live off the land with meager supplies for a full school week. Daily physical and mental challenges are used to pit the tribes against each other for rewards, such as food or luxuries, or for "immunity", forcing the other tribe to attend "Tribal Council", where they must vote off one of their players.

Once about half the players are remaining, the tribes are merged into a single tribe, and competitions are on an individual basis; winning immunity prevents that player from being voted out. Players that are voted out form the game's "jury". Once down to three people, a final Tribal Council is held where the remaining players plead their case to the jury members. The jury then votes for which player should be considered the "Sole Survivor" and win the show's grand prize: a MacBook Air.

Numerous modifications, or "twists", on the core rules can be put in place in order to keep the players on their toes and to prevent players from relying on strategies that succeeded in prior seasons. These changes have included tribal switches, hidden immunity idols that players can use to save themselves at Tribal Council, random immunity during the Tribal Council, and a chance to return to the game after elimination through a school wide vote.

This competition will put your physical, emotional, and mental strength to the test as you attempt to beat the odds and defeat your peers. The end goal is simple: outwit, outplay, and outlast your competitors, and your legacy will live forever in the OCHS Survivor Hall of Fame.

Contestant Requirements:

1. Agree to stay at the school for the ENTIRE week of the competition. Not all contestants will stay the duration of the contest, but you must be available. No exceptions will be made for jobs, extracurriculars, etc., but those who participate in a spring sports at OCHS may be escorted to practice, given that it does not interfere with challenges or tribal councils later in the evening.
2. Agree to be filmed and broadcasted to the school each day.
3. Agree to abide by all competition rules.
4. Maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA and 90% attendance.
5. Wear the provided t-shirt for duration of the competition.
6. Agree to be physically and mentally prepared to compete in demanding, high-intensity challenges.
7. Understand that if an injury occurs that requires you to leave the school, Oregon City High school, OCHS Student Government, and/or the Survivor Committee cannot be held responsible in any way and you will be eliminated from the competition immediately.
8. Understand that this is a spin-off of a reality TV show and that your words and actions may be presented through media in a way that does not reflect your intentions.

Survivor Competition Rules

1. Students must stay at Oregon City High School under the direction and supervision of ASB, Mr. Lord and their chaperones for the entire duration of their participation in Oregon City High School Survivor. If for any reason a contestant leaves the school, they forfeit their opportunity to be in the competition. Contestants must stay in the building AT ALL TIMES.
2. Contestants must wear their Survivor t-shirt AT ALL TIMES.
3. Contestants will be permitted to bring ONE personal bag or suitcase and ONE bag for sleeping items to pack the personal items they wish to bring with them to the Survivor competition. No food is to be packed in either bag. Contestants will also supply their own sleeping bag and pillow in addition to the items in their personal bag. No air mattresses are allowed. Contestants will also be permitted to have school materials/backpack. These

items will be inspected prior to the competition to look for “contraband items.”

4. Contestants are not allowed outside food. Meals and meal supplies will be provided by ASB, and lunches must be eaten in the Student Council room (F128). Contestants that consume outside food or have food brought to them forfeit their right to compete.
5. Contestants will forfeit their phones to survivor staff at the beginning of the contest. They will be placed in a box and locked in a safe. Parents will be provided with Mr. Lord’s contact information and the student director’s phone numbers for emergency purposes. This is done to maintain the secrecy of the outcome of events, and to enhance the “Survivor experience.”
6. Contestants, even if eliminated, will return to the final tribal council on Friday to serve on the jury and choose the ultimate Survivor.
7. There will be academic time set aside each day for contestants; if academic issues arise with classes it may result in dismissal from the competition.
8. Understand that challenges may be difficult and somewhat unpleasant (ex. “Smoothie challenge”) but will not be unsafe.
9. Understand and accept that if my personal conduct is unbecoming of a student at OCHS and Survivor participant, that you will be removed from the event. This includes poor grades, missing school/truancies, excessive tardiness, fighting, the use of firearms, drugs or alcohol, misuse of social media, cheating, stealing, time spent in ISS or OSS, after school detention, teacher detentions, disrespect to faculty and administration at school or in relation to any school activity. This is a SCHOOL event. All school rules still apply.
10. Contestants can make a 5 minute phone call each day.
11. School functions such as sports games may be attended by contestants, but only if they occur on campus and do not conflict with challenges or tribal councils.
12. OCHS ASB reserves the right to change or adapt the Survivor competition as needed.
13. Decisions made by ASB, Mr. Lord, and the jury are FINAL.
