



# Oregon City High School

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## COMMUNITY AND DISTRICT

Oregon City, located about fifteen miles south of Portland, has a population of approximately 33,940. Located at the end of the Oregon Trail and the first incorporated city west of the Mississippi River, it is a city of great historical significance. Oregon City School District has an enrollment of 7,044 students in one high school (9-12), two middle schools (6-8), and seven elementary schools (K-5). There are four charter schools; Oregon City Service Learning Academy (9-12), Clackamas Academy of Industrial Science (8-12), Alliance Charter Academy for home school students (K-12), and Springwater Environmental Sciences School for elementary age students (K-8).

## HIGH SCHOOL

Oregon City High School, established in 1885, is a four-year comprehensive public school serving 2,157 students. It is accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary Schools and High Schools. OCHS is a member of the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) and the Mt. Hood Conference (6A-3).

## ACADEMICS

Seventy-five percent of OCHS graduates continue their formal education after high school. Recent students have included National Merit Scholars, and Presidential Scholars. Graduates have been admitted to private and public universities across the United States, and to honors programs at distinguished universities. OCHS Seniors annually earn approximately \$2 million in scholarships and financial aid.

## OTHER INFORMATION

OCHS prides itself on being inclusive of all students and strives to meet a multitude of special needs and diversities. OCHS students are afforded the opportunity to earn college credits and high school credits at the same time. OCHS offers JROTC (Junior Reserve Officers Training Program), one of only five such programs in Oregon. Students may also earn up to one credit through a work experience program.

OCHS does not accept home-schooling credit or credit from non-accredited schools.

## SCHEDULE

The school year is based on a trimester system of twelve weeks. Class periods are 74 minutes in length. Academic courses are worth .500 credits. (A full year course is credited with 1.500 credits).
