Counselors

Scholarships

Scholarships are free money for college given to students with good grades, athletic ability, community service or other unique qualities by businesses, organizations, or universities. Scholarships range in both amounts and competitiveness: a local scholarship may offer \$500 for one year, but will only be open to seniors at your high school, while a national scholarship may offer \$10,000 for four years of college, but will be open to students across the country. Here's how your student can get the most out of the scholarship application process:

- Apply for **local** scholarships at the high school, in the community, & from employers
- Check out scholarships on fastweb.com, scholarships.com, & bigfuture.collegeboard.org, oregongoestocollege.org/pay/scholarships
- Fill out the **OSAC Scholarship** application before March 1st. There are over 500 scholarships for Oregon students with only one application to complete
- Many scholarships ask for an essay response. You can use the same essay for several different scholarships

FAFSA FACTS

Over **50%** of OCHS students have completed a FAFSA.

Bachelor Degree:

an undergraduate academic degree awarded for a course of study that generally lasts 4 years. Colleges or universities generally award bachelor's degrees.

Associate Degree:

an undergraduate academic degree granted after completion of two years of study. Community colleges and career colleges generally award associate degrees.

Juniors!

If you are planning on attending a 4 year college or university, sign-up for the SAT or ACT this Spring. Most 4 year schools require an SAT/ACT score as part of the application process.

OCHS School Code: 380-785

Community colleges don't require SAT or ACT scores.

SAT FACTS

Registration Deadline	About 4 weeks before the test date
Test duration	3 hours + 50 minutes for optional essay
Major sections	Math, reading, writing, language and an optional essay
Scoring	400 - 1600

ACT FACTS

Registration Deadline	About 5 weeks before the test date
Test duration	2 hours, 55 minutes + 40 minutes for optional essay
Major sections	English, math, reading, science and an optional writing section
Scoring	1-36
